

Social Venture Partners Cincinnati Names Civic Garden Center First Social Investment Partner

\$25,000 and a team of experts will help them launch new "green" initiative

June 11, 2008—CINCINNATI—Social Venture Partners Cincinnati today named the Civic Garden Center its first social investment partner awarding the organization \$25,000 along with a team of experts to assist them in building and operationalizing a Green Learning Station. To be built on the nearby site of an old gas station, the Station will provide education and inspiration to builders, developers, home owners and officials to incorporate green technology into their residences, businesses and public spaces. The Station also will be used as a children's learning center.

Glenn Bitzenhofer, chair of the SVP Investment Committee, said the Civic Garden Center was chosen because its needs were the best match currently for SVP Cincinnati's model of engaged giving.

"The inventory of available partners and their skills was a critical factor in our decision," said Bitzenhofer. "Our \$25,000 investment comes with a goal of building the capacity of the organization, based on partners who give their time and skills to make a true impact on the community.

SVP Cincinnati offers expertise in several categories: business and strategic planning, project management, marketing, etc.

"We will work with the Civic Garden Center to put together a team that best meets their needs," said Bitzenhofer.

The engagement between Civic Garden Center and SVP Cincinnati is expected to last 3-5 years.

"This is a very timely project and one that we felt, ultimately, had the best chance of making an immediate impact on our community and the environment," said Bitzenhofer. "While the Civic Garden Center is an established organization, they are moving in an innovative new direction, which will significantly impact the environment. This bold step is an exciting risk."
